



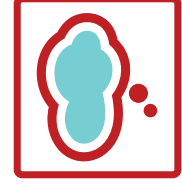

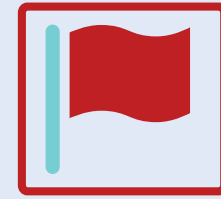

- Climate change is one of the most threatening environmental crises facing today's world. The quality of our lives and our future will be decided by how we deal with the many aspects of energy use and climate change. The good news is that you have a chance to do something about it.
- Jeremy Leggett who was described by Time magazine as "one of the next generation of young leaders." An environmental campaigner for Greenpeace International, he won the US Climate Institute's Award for Advancing Understanding, as "one of the half-dozen experts most responsible for putting climate change on the international agenda." He has written two books, an account of the first ten years of global warming entitled, The Carbon War. His latest book is an account of peak oil and its conflation with global warming Half Gone - Oil, Gas, Hot Air and the Global Energy Crisis.
- The event will inform people between 16 and 25 years old on the issues, and most importantly on how we can respond. Films, new media, world café discussions and interactive sessions will be used in sharing experiences and ideas.

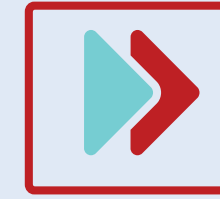

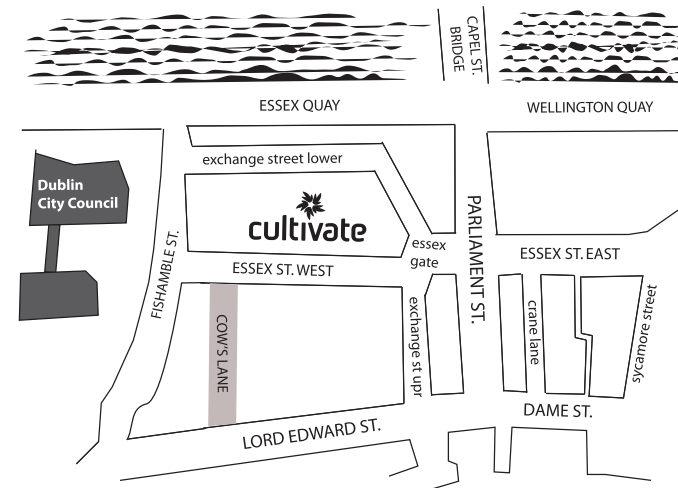
